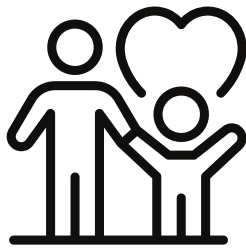


Book an appointment at a clinic where you will be seen by a physician or nurse who can assess you and provide medications or prescriptions if needed.
